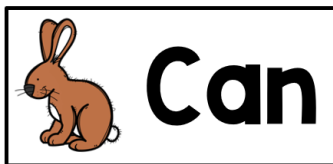
## Lesson Plans

### INTRODUCTION:

Read any nonfiction book about rabbits. Here are a few suggestions:



Create a can Can-Have-Are chart. Example:



- dig burrows
- hop
- eat grass
- molt



- long ears
- strong legs
- short bushy tail



- mammals
- social
- good pets
- different than hares

Students will use the Can-Have-Are chart to complete the writing page (3 options). You can direct them to choose a word or two from each section to write about rabbits. Then they can color the page.

### LABEL A RABBIT

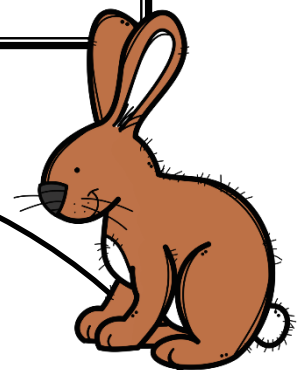
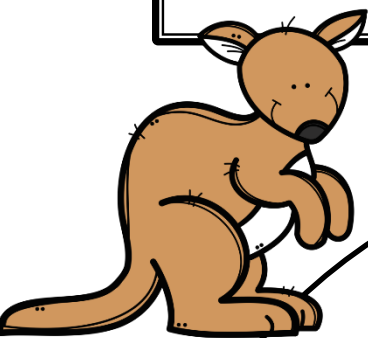
Students can practice labeling a rabbit with the center activity and/or cut and paste version.

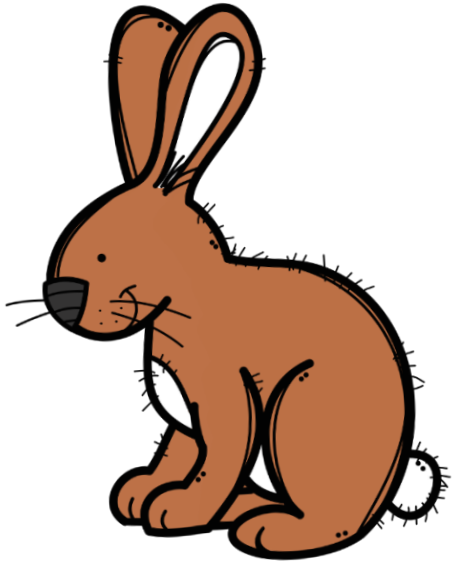
### EMERGENT READER

Students will color, cut, and staple together the emergent reader. Read it with them first, then have them practice reading on their own or with a partner.

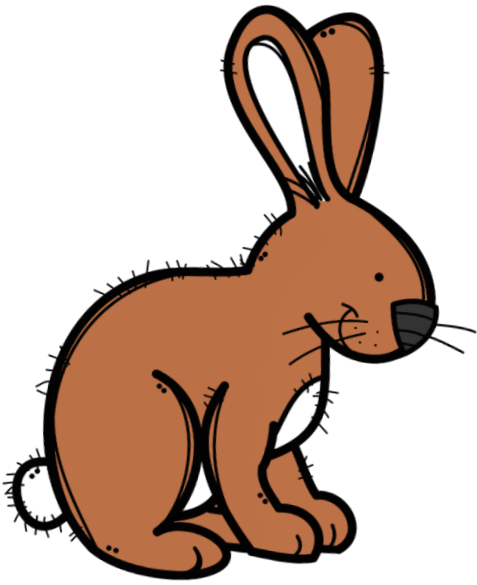
# Rabbits



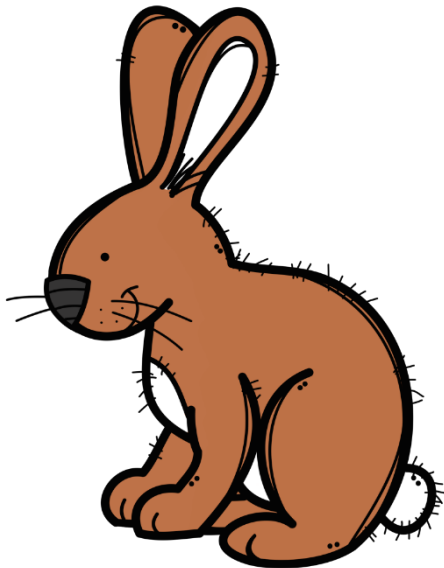
